SECTION 1. <u>AUTHORITY:</u> This Local Law is enacted pursuant to the authority of Article 9A of the General Municipal Law of the State of New York, and shall be known as the Games of Chance Law of the Town of New Lisbon, New York.

SECTION 2. <u>DEFINITION</u>: The words and terms used in this Local Law shall have the same meaning as such words and terms that are used in Article 9A of the General Municipal Law of the State of New York.

SECTION 3. GAMES OF CHANCE AUTHORIZED:RESTRICTIONS: Games of Chance may be conducted in the Town of New Lisbon, New York by any authorized organization, after obtaining a license therefore, in accordance with the provisions, requirements, and limitations of Article 9A of the General Municipal Law, the rules and regulations of the New York State Racing and Wagering Board and this Local Law. The conduct of Games of Chance on Sundays is authorized, except as otherwise restricted in Article 9A of the General Municipal Law.

SECTION 4. <u>ENFORCEMENT</u>: The Powers and Duties of set forth in Subdivision 1 of Section 194 of the General Municipal Law shall be exercised by the Chief Law Enforcement Officer of the County of Otsego.

SECTION 5. <u>EFFECTIVE DATE</u>: This Local Law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State after approval thereof by the voters of the Town of New Lisbon, New York voting thereon at the General Election of 2000.
